During a routine check up in January, it was discovered that Brenda has developed advanced lung cancer. Further testing showed that she also has lesions on her brain. This is what the medical team decided to treat first. They have also done a biopsy of the lung mass. At the point of writing this report, she has been receiving radiation as well as medication to reduce cranial swelling.

My Deliverer

About ten years ago, after dropping David off at the airport and while driving alone from Kelowna to Vernon, I found myself instantaneously immersed in a random, blinding snowstorm. It was the kind of driving snow that seemed to come directly at eye level. My heart started pounding as I realized I was driving alongside the lake just a few feet to my right and there were no barriers. I couldn't see any lines on the road nor could I see any cars in front of me or behind me. I was absolutely and terrifyingly alone! I began to repeat, "Help me Jesus! Help me Jesus!" over and over without stopping. I had no idea where the many twists and turns in the highway were, and I was going in complete blind faith that God would deliver me from this perilous situation.

Suddenly to my right I heard what sounded like a booming voice saying, "Get over here!" I briefly glanced out of the corner of my eye and saw a large transport truck with the driver frantically motioning me to come his way. I realized with a start that my car had wandered across the highway line to my left and I was about to drop off into an embankment in front of one of the larger hills I was passing through. Going completely by faith, I steered the car to the right towards the truck. It then roared ahead and was immediately out of sight, not even leaving any red tail lights to follow.

No other cars were coming towards me and I was again alone repeating "Help me Jesus, Help me Jesus!"

About five minutes before entering the city of Vernon, the snow instantly stopped as suddenly as it had started. I was still shaking when I reached home. Later I heard on the news that a "freak" storm had unexpectedly passed "like a large ribbon between Winfield and Vernon at the exact time I was driving.


I have thought many times about God saving me from harm and possible death that night, and each time I am so grateful to God my Deliverer for sparing my life.

Life is full of many situations, some smaller, some critical, where we call upon the name of the Lord to deliver us from them. Sometimes we or those we love are spared from them, but other times God chooses to leave us in the middle of the storm, asking us to trust Him to see us through.

I don't know what God has in store for us with David's cancer, but I have times of feeling complete helplessness, of coming close to the edge, of sensing the lurking danger beside, behind and in front of me. So many times I pray, "Help us Jesus, help us!"

The path ahead is unknown, and at times like today I am blinded by tears, wondering if we will ever return to Fairhaven on Silver Star Mountain, the place we love and where we have found rest, renewal and refuge many times over the years. However, I choose to say, "God, help me to accept Your plan for me in the future, whatever it is. You are my Rock, my Refuge, my Hiding Place, my Hope, my Comfort, my Peace, and my Deliverer. Save me from living with fear and anxiety. Cover me with a blanket of Your peace. Help both David and I to live with hope and courage, and to be thankful for and cherish each day You give us. Amen."
